The Arlington County Community Oversight Board (COB), with the Independent Police Auditor, independently reviews and addresses public grievances against the police department and has the power to investigate complaints and recommend actions. ## **Douglas Park Trees Removed**

Douglas Park has had some trees removed recently, and could have more to be removed in the near future. On the south side of Douglas Park, several Ailanthus altissima (Tree of Heaven) trees were removed, which



are invasive species. The Tree of Heaven trees were removed before they suppressed the growth of other plants in the area. They are especially difficult to remove and need to be treated with an herbicide first, otherwise it would respond to being cut down with hundreds of root sprouts. Other invasive species of trees and bushes will be removed from the park, as they negatively stress the native vegetation. As other trees are moved as part of the Douglas Park Phase 1 renovation, the Douglas Park Civic Association will continue to work with Arlington County's Department of Parks and Recreation to ensure the park has a healthy tree canopy.

# **New Car Tax Enforcement** Coming

The Arlington County Commissioner of Revenue's Office will be starting a new pilot program to enforce vehicle tax payments in Arlington County. This program will have a vehicle with an Automatic License Plate Reader driving around Douglas Park and the rest of Arlington County looking for vehicles regularly parked in the county and are subject to personal property tax. Over the next three months (November 2024 - January 2025), the Personal Property Enforcement Program (PPEP) Team will be driving through your Civic Association's neighborhood.
